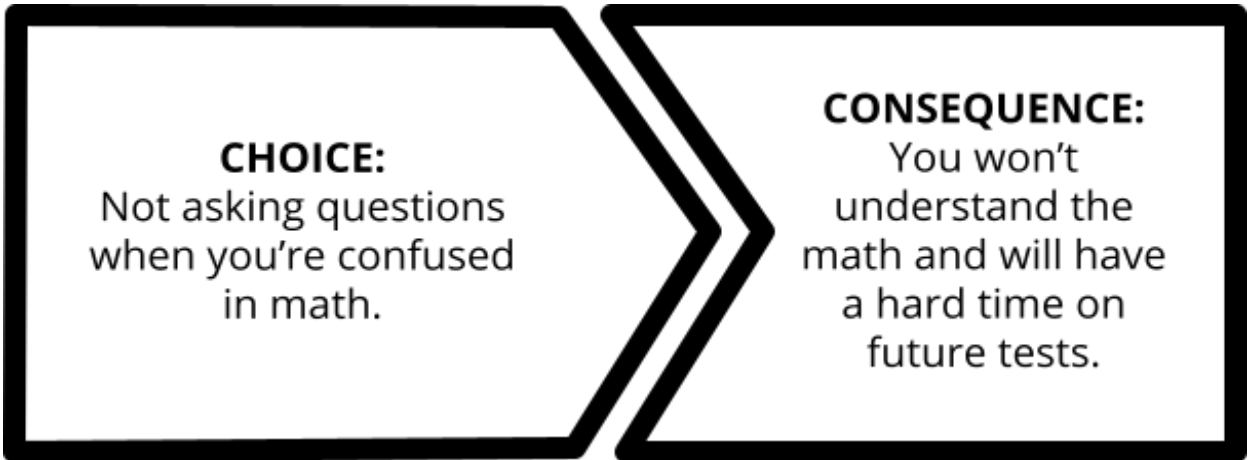
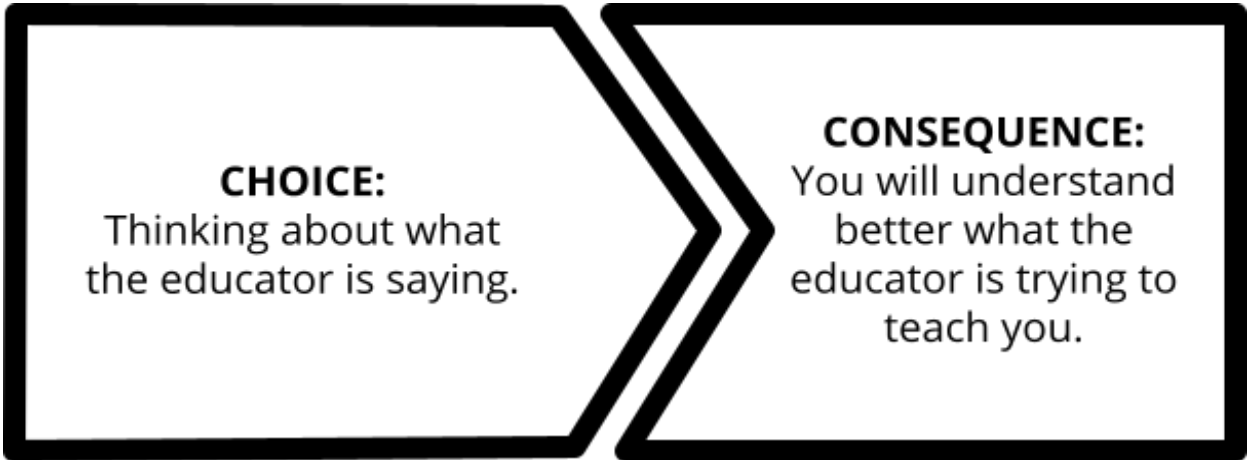
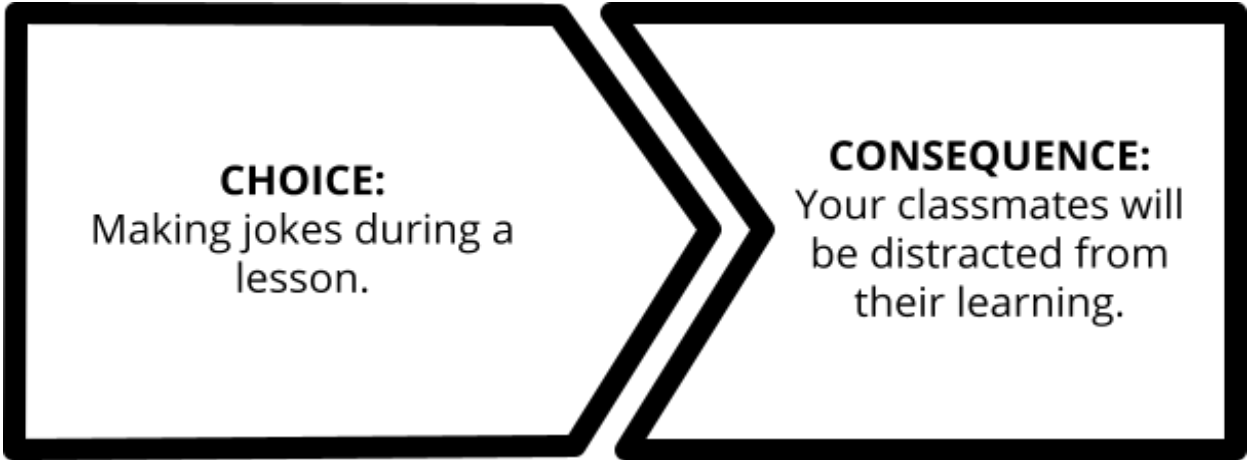
(Two-Piece Puzzles)

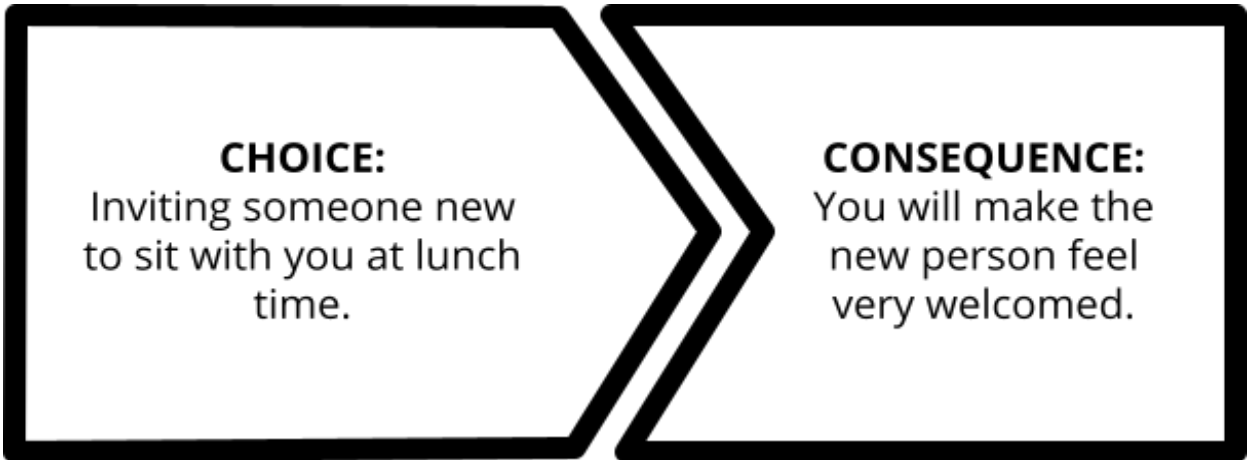
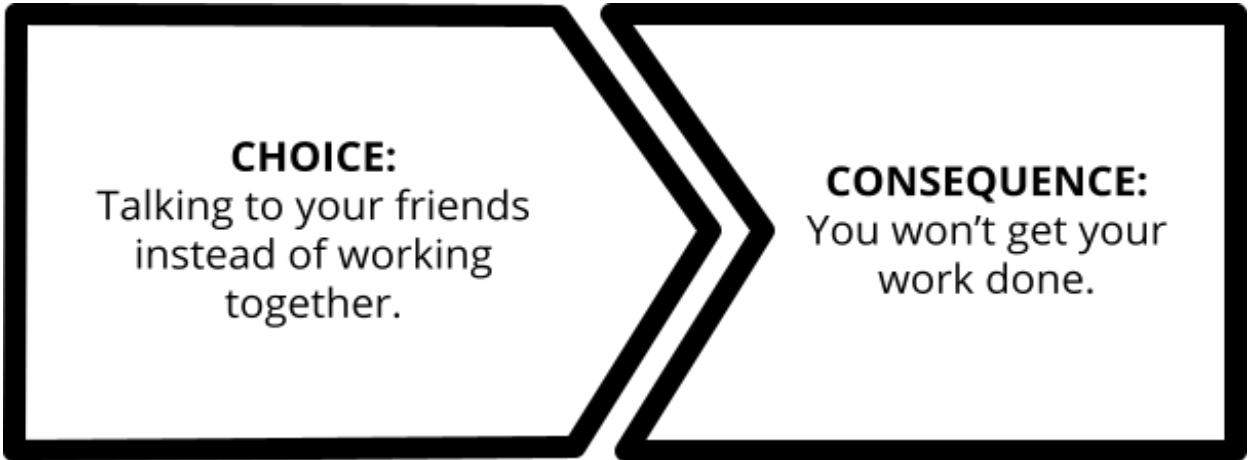
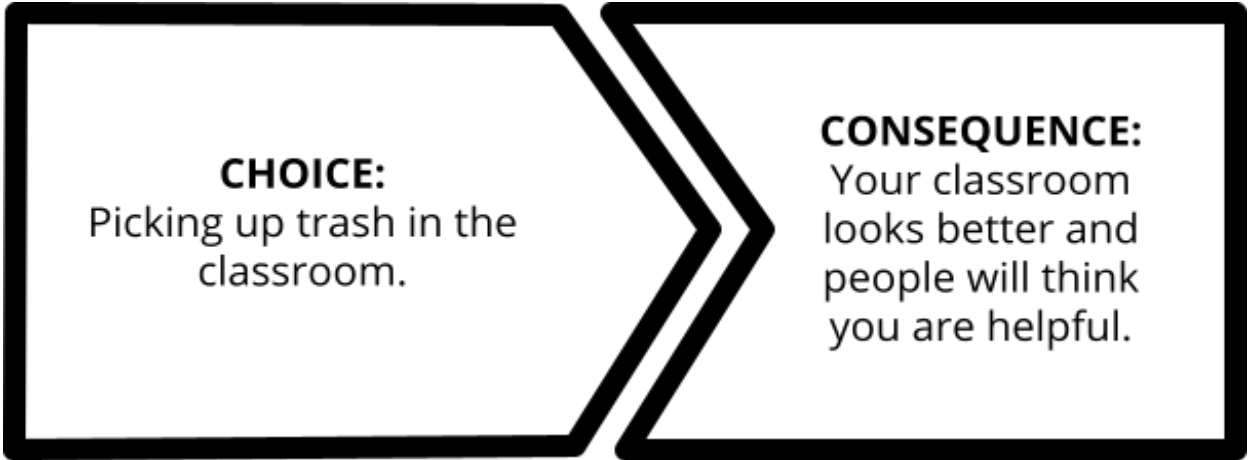


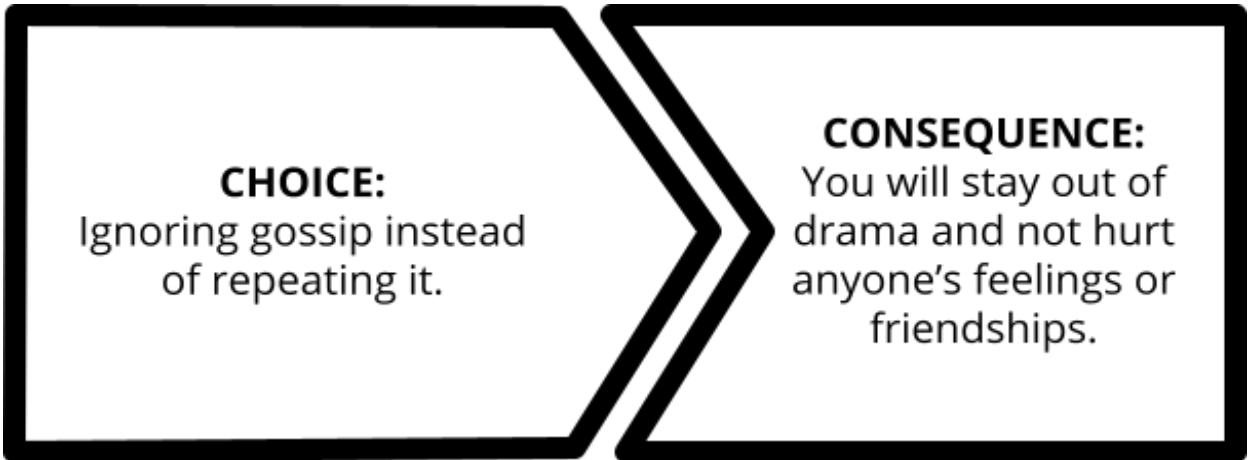
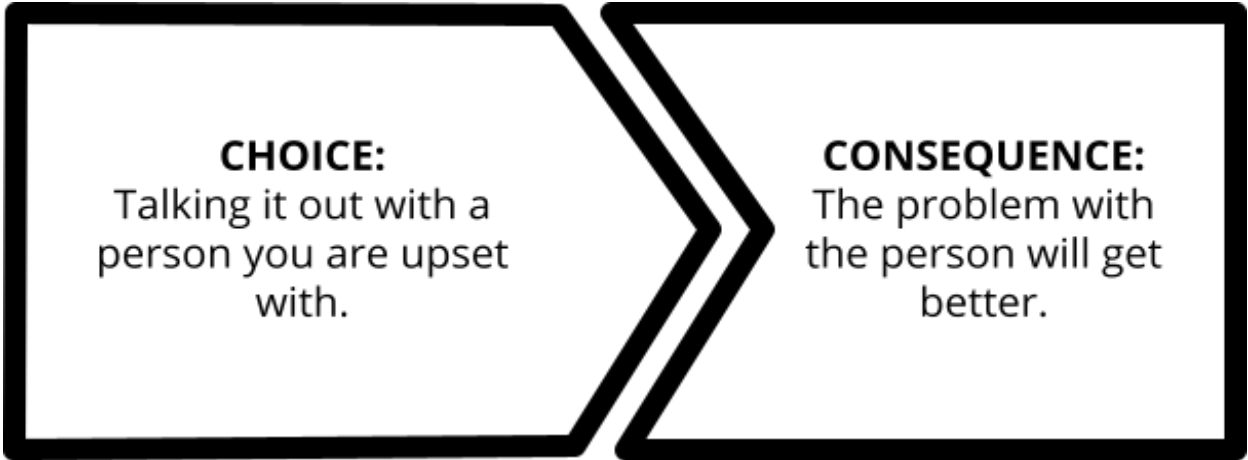

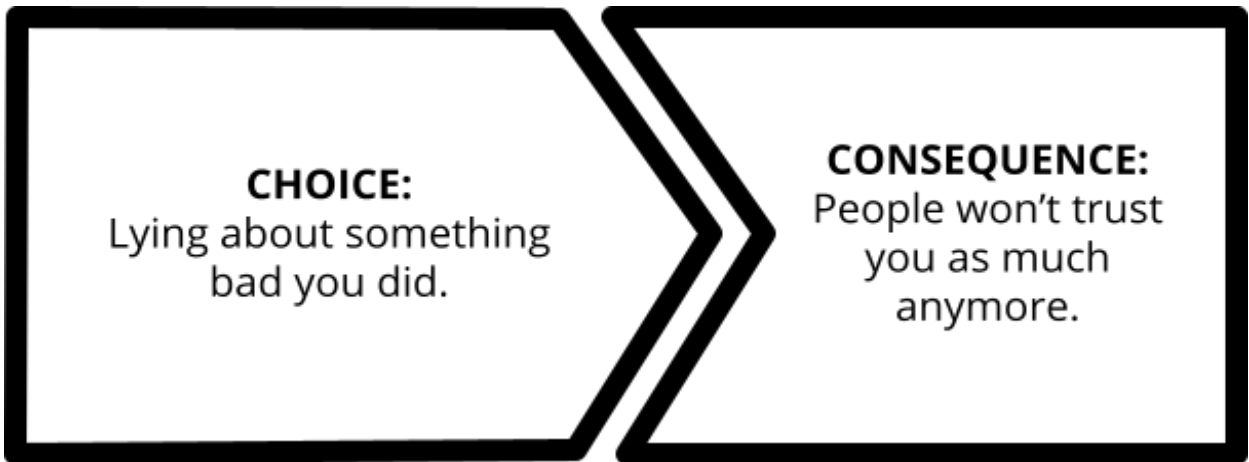
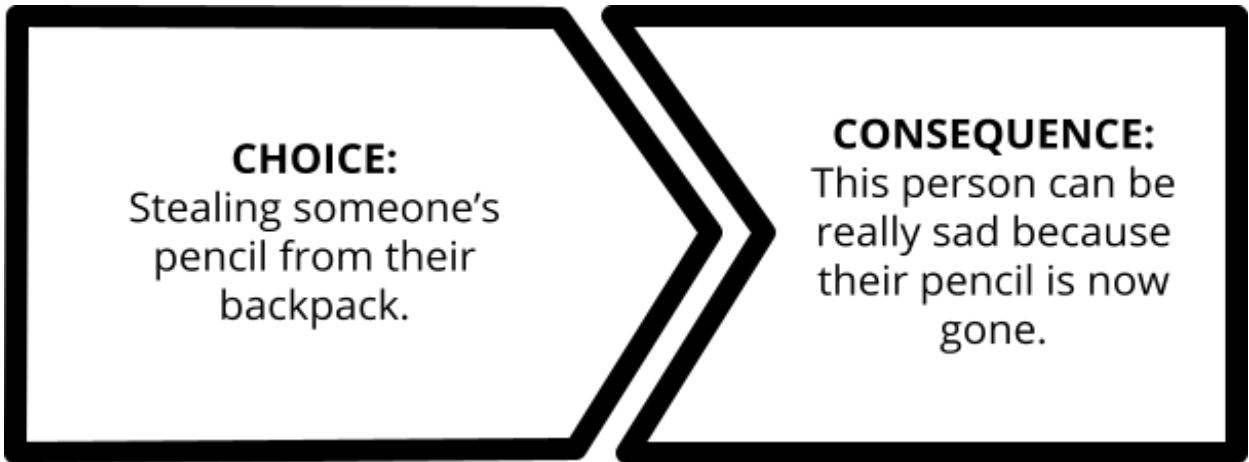


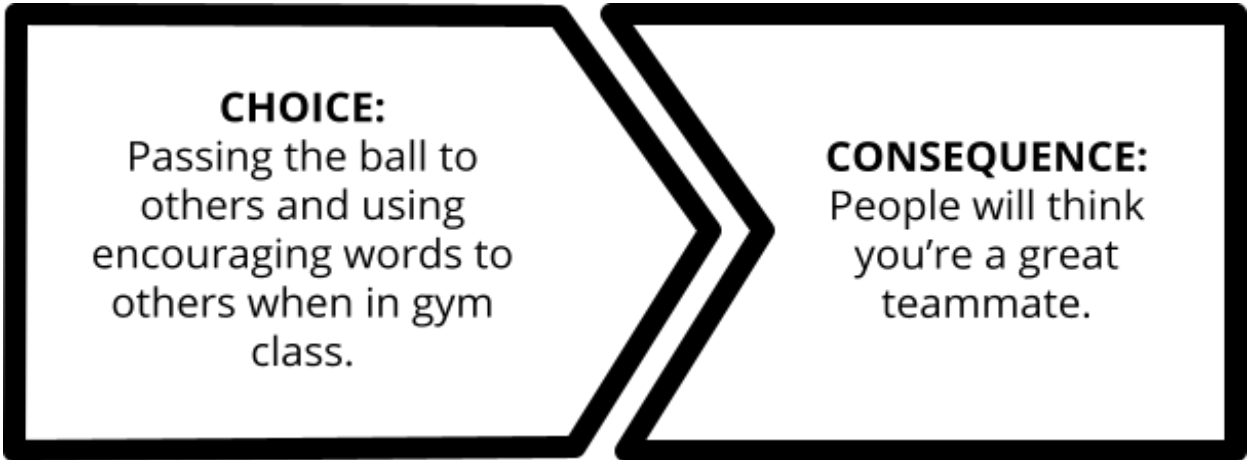












CHOICE:
